INTRODUCING: MALOU MARCETTO

LONDON CITY LIONESSES ARE DELIGHTED TO CONFIRM
THE SIGNING OF MIDFIELDER MALOU MARCETTO.

The 22-year-old Dane arrives from Liga F club Madrid CFF and has penned a deal until the summer of 2028.

Marcetto has played in top European women's competitions in her career to date. She started out at Brøndby IF in Denmark's A-Liga after progressing through the club's academy. She made 51 senior appearances between 2020 and 2023, scoring nine goals in the 2021-2022 season to help her team finish third in the league.

The Denmark U23 international then moved to Dijon FCO in France's D1 Féminine where she established herself as a regular before transferring to Madrid CFF in the summer of 2024.

In Liga F, Marcetto made 40 league appearances for the Madrid outfit, contributing five goals and seven assists and was a consistent performer.

Internationally, Marcetto has represented Denmark at U16, U17, U19 and U23 age groups with notable involvement in European Championship qualifying campaigns. She featured in nine matches, netting four goals as Denmark attempted qualification for the UEFA European Women's Under-17 Championship while in 2021-2022, Marcetto progressed to the U19 team, accumulating 11 caps and four goals, with notable involvement in the qualifiers for the 2022 UEFA European Women's Under-19 Championship.

MARCETTO ON JOINING LONDON CITY...

On joining, Marcetto said:

"I feel very excited and so happy to be here.

"The facilities are great and the people I've met have made me feel really welcome.

"England just reminds me of, and makes me think of, football. It's the biggest football country, in my opinion. Women's football is growing here and it's going to be a very competitive league to play in, I'm really excited to be here and get started.

"London is a cool city. I'm from Copenhagen so I think I'll fit in very well. I'm so happy to be here.

"In terms of my playing style, as a midfielder, I like to be creative and also work hard.

"My aim is to be do the best for the team. Winning and earning points for the team is the important thing."


HEAD COACH: SCOTT PHELAN

Scott Phelan has been appointed Interim Head Coach of Everton Women for the remainder of the season following the club's decision to part company with Brian Sørensen. Phelan, 37, is a product of Everton's Academy, where he captained the Club's Under-18s and earned England caps at Under-16, Under-17 and Under-18 level before going on to a senior playing career. Since retiring, he has coached within Everton's Finch Farm Academy for more than 10 years, holding lead roles across multiple age groups, including the men's Under-18s and Under-23s. A UEFA A Licence coach, Phelan transitioned into coaching following spells as a player with Bradford City, Halifax Town and Kidderminster Harriers. He will be assisted by Jennifer Foster and goalkeeping coach Ian McCaldon.

GOALKEEPER COURTNEY BROSNAH

Goalkeeper Courtney Elizabeth Brosnan was born in Millburn, New Jersey (USA) on 10 November 1995. She played college soccer at Syracuse University before turning professional with Ambilly (France), then Le Havre, and West Ham United. Brosnan signed for Everton Women on 26 July 2021 and has made over 60 WSL appearances. Internationally, she represents the Republic of Ireland, earning over 50 caps and playing at the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup. She has won multiple individual honours, including FAI International Women's Player of the Year.

MARTINA FERNÁNDEZ

Martina Fernández, born 1 October 2004 in Spain, is a defender who joined Everton Women initially on loan from FC Barcelona in January 2025 before signing permanently in July 2025. She came through Barcelona's youth ranks and was part of the squad that won the 2024–25 Liga F title. Since joining Everton, she has been a regular starter and was named the club's Young Player of the Season following her loan spell.

MEGAN FINNIGAN

Megan Finnigan, born 2 April 1998 in England, is a central defender and captain of Everton Women. She joined Everton's academy at age nine and progressed through the youth system. Finnigan made her first-team debut in 2015 and signed her first professional contract in 2017. A long-serving member of the squad, she has been club captain since 2023 and has made well over 100 appearances across all competitions for Everton.

HONOKA HAYASHI

Honoka Hayashi was born on 19 May 1998 in Uji, Kyoto, Japan. A midfielder, she began her career with Cerezo Osaka, played for AIK in Sweden, and spent two seasons with West Ham United before signing for Everton Women in July 2024. Internationally, Hayashi has been capped by Japan since 2019 and has played in major tournaments including the Olympics and the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup.

MIDFIELDER RUBY MACE

English midfielder/defender Ruby Mace was born on 5 September 2003 in Upminster, England. A product of the Arsenal academy, she made her senior debut with Arsenal before moving to Manchester City in 2021. Mace had spells at Birmingham City (loan) and Leicester City, joining Everton in September 2025 on a club-record fee. She has represented England at U17, U19, U23 levels and made her senior debut in December 2024. Her honours include winning the FA Women's League Cup with Manchester City in 2021–22.

ORNELLA VIGNOLA

Ornella Maria Vignola Cabot was born on 30 September 2004 in Montevideo, Uruguay and raised in Spain. A midfielder/winger, she began at Málaga B, spent time with Barcelona (including Barcelona B), then played for Sevilla, Alavés and Granada before joining Everton Women on 4 July 2025. On her Everton debut she scored a hat-trick in a Merseyside derby – the first Everton player, men's or women's, to score a derby hat-trick since 1931. Vignola has represented Spain at youth international level and won the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup in 2022. multiple Nadeshiko League titles and an AFC Women's Club Championship.

YUKA MOMIKI

Yūka Momiki, born 9 April 1996 in the USA, is an attacking midfielder/forward for Everton Women and the Japan national team. She started her career at Nippon TV Tokyo Verdy Beleza, winning multiple Nadeshiko League titles and domestic cups. Momiki moved to OL Reign in 2020, then Linköpings FC in Sweden, and signed with Leicester City in 2024. She joined Everton in July 2025 following the expiry of her contract at Leicester. Her honours include multiple Nadeshiko League titles and an AFC Women's Club Championship.

WASSA SANGARÉ ANSWERS QUESTIONS WITH A SMILE, AND USUALLY WITH A SMALL LAUGH WHEN SHE SEARCHES FOR THE RIGHT WORDS. ENGLISH ISN'T HER FIRST LANGUAGE, AND SHE TAKES HER TIME, BUT THERE'S AN EASE ABOUT HER NOW THAT SUGGESTS SHE FEELS COMFORTABLE. SETTLED.

Halfway through the season, she's not just settled, she's become a key name on the London City Lionesses team sheet. "Yes, I feel good," she says, simply. "I'm very happy. I love playing and being with the team. It's a really amazing place." It hasn't always felt this familiar. Looking back at her first week at the club, it feels distant already.

"It feels like a long time ago!" she laughs. "I think I've learnt fast, and a lot here, and everyone believes in me and makes me feel welcome."

That belief didn't come overnight. Her early weeks were about adapting to a new league, a new country and a new style of football. "Yes, everything surprised me!" she says of life in England. "Maybe everything, even the people are a bit different!"

"I'm used to being here now," she says. "I've been to London; I did some shopping. I love shopping and I go all the

time. I've been on the London Eye too!" A good day off is simple, and very Wassa. "I like to rest on a day off for a start," she says. "I might go to London. I love buying clothes and shopping. I've been to Bluewater too, when I am too lazy to go to London! It's all in a circle so you can't get lost!"

There are still things she misses. "I miss my family and my friends from France," she admits. "Sometimes French food too, like the bread is different. It's nice here, but better at home!"

On the pitch, Wassa had to earn her way in senior football. She didn't start against Arsenal, played limited minutes against Manchester United, but then came Everton away.

Her first start for London City Lionesses. The club's first Women's Super League win of the season. A statement performance at Goodison Park. "It was my first start," she says. "And I got told

to just enjoy the moment and do the best I can do.”

She did more than that. “It was the first win of the season, at Goodison Park,” she adds, “so it was great for not just myself, but the team’s confidence too.”

Something shifted when she said that. The quiet, giggly presence off the pitch was met by authority on it — composed, physical, dominant in duels.

At just 19, she became a constant in London City lineup. “I think yes,” she says when asked if she felt trust after the Everton game. “I got told, train hard every day, and if you play it’s good, and if you don’t, you keep working hard.” “Now I play, but I keep working hard!” It’s a mindset that sums her up.

Sangaré is thoughtful when she reflects on her own development. She doesn’t

overanalyse, but she knows where she’s improved. “I think physically,” she says. “Also, my one-vs-one defending, my anticipation as well. I think I have become a more well-rounded defender.” The WSL has demanded that growth. “The physicality is strong; it is very demanding,” she explains. “The best thing about this league is that everyone can beat everyone and there are no easy games.”

She’s also been surrounded by experience — and she’s made the most of it. “Yes, I have learnt a lot from the experienced players,” she says. “I talk to Linus a lot, she talks to me a lot in games too. It is nice to learn from her on the pitch and in training too.”

You can see it in matches, the constant communication, the calm decisions, the quiet leadership from someone still learning the language, but already fluent in defending.



CHATTING TO WASSA SANGARÉ



This season hasn't just been about club football. Wassa's rise has been recognised at international level too, earning her a senior call-up and debut for France. "I was so surprised," she says. "I got a call after training. It was amazing."

There was comfort in familiarity. "It was nice to know Grace there too," she smiles. "It was the best moment of my career."

When she looks ahead, her goals are simple. Honest. Very 'Wassa'. "I just want to keep playing games," she says. "I didn't expect to play so many and that was my aim, to get experience." There are highlights she'll always remember. "I loved scoring against



Sunderland in the FA Cup," she says. "That was a highlight and one of the best moments for me, it felt really good to score."

She wants to feel the same way again. "I'm not obsessed with it," she adds, smiling again, "but if the opportunity comes up, I'd love to score a goal in the Women's Super League too."

Wassa Sangaré might still speak softly, might still laugh nervously at questions, might still miss French bread – but on the pitch, she's anything but uncertain. Halfway through the season, she hasn't just settled in. She's become essential.

LONDON CITY LIONESSES CAN CONFIRM THAT PAULA PARTIDO HAS BEEN RECALLED FROM HER LOAN SPELL WITH DUX LOGROÑO, RETURNING TO THE COPPERJAX COMMUNITY STADIUM THIS JANUARY.

The 20-year-old winger spent the first half of the 2024/25 season in Spain, making 17 appearances across Liga F and the Copa de la Reina. During her time with Logroño, Partido registered one goal and one assist, gaining valuable senior minutes in a highly competitive domestic environment.

Since arriving at London City Lionesses from Real Madrid in the summer, Partido has continued her development through consistent match exposure, building on her experience across elite European competitions and international youth football.

Her recall now brings another exciting option into the squad as the season enters a crucial phase, with Partido returning having added top-flight experience to her game.



Speaking on her return to London City Lionesses, Partido expressed her excitement about getting started back in England.

"I'm really happy to be here, I can't wait to get started and I want to play every minute the Head Coach gives me.

"The loan was important for me; it definitely gave me confidence in myself as a player."

Partido also reflected on her development, the support around her at the club, and the qualities she hopes to bring to the pitch.

"The Spanish players at the club, and Head Coach Eder can help me learn in football, but also the language too.

"I'm a player who likes to run, I'm fast, I like taking people on one-vs-one, they are my best abilities.

"I'm so happy to be here and I can't wait to meet the fans in the stadium."
